#### **Active Travel**

This week, we were delighted to receive a Modeshift bronze award for promoting active and sustainable travel to school, which included a number of workshops and training for the pupils over the last year such as road safety and cycling.

There will be further initiatives and events over the course of 2024- 2025 as we aim to achieve a silver award.

Our targets for this year are: to increase the number of journeys to and from school that involve 'park & stride' and walking to school and for an increase of times school staff cycle to school.

There is funding attached to this award for us to improve our cycle and scooter storage and to provide seating on the playground for parents.

We will be launching 'our park and stride' initiative in partnership with Cromhall Chapel soon.
